Southeast Louisiana Veterans Health Care System is scheduled to see its first patient in its new Medical Center by

the end of December 2016. The 1.6 million sq. ft. facility, in Mid-City New Orleans, is currently 87 percent complete and will open in phases, beginning with outpatient services.

Veterans in southeast Louisiana have not had a VA hospital since 2005, when Hurricane Katrina rendered the New Orleans VA Medical Center unusable. This new replacement facility will be a tertiary care regional referral center with 200 inpatient beds for medical care, surgical care, transitional care, hospice, palliative care and physical rehabilitation.

During the activation, the health care system will continue to provide health care to Veterans in one of its eight community based outpatient clinics.

"Those clinics will remain in Baton Rouge, Franklin, Hammond, Houma, New Orleans, Slidell and St. John Parish even after the new hospital is built," said SLVHCS Medical Center Director Fernando O. Rivera, FACHE.

When complete, the Medical Center is designed to meet the full array of the health care missions, including education, research and, supporting national emergency preparedness and assistance.

Membership:

For 2016 year - Our goal for the year is 22,300. Current membership is 89.12%. The May 11 goal was 100% - we have

failed to meet the National goal.

National Dues Increase: As most already know, National voted to increase dues \$5.00 beginning January 12, 2016. Dues to Department are now \$29.50 for new and renewals.

Legionnaire: The next Legionnaire will be published in August 2016. I ask each District Commander, each Post Commander, and Committee Chairman to submit an article to show what has been going on in your Districts and Committees. This is your Legionnaire to let all our members know what is going on. I will need your articles and photos not later than July 1, 2016.

NEF: The new National Commander, Dale Barrett, wants to replenish the National Emergency Fund. We expect our NEF goal from National this year is \$11,540.00. As of this date, contributions are at \$5,157.50. We encourage all Posts to contribute to this fund since Louisiana depends heavily on this fund following hurricane emergencies.

Poppy Fund: Funds derived from Poppy sales are the funds we can use for Children & Youth programs and Temporary Financial Assistance. We are getting an increased number of requests from veterans and their families for these funds. Bylaws Article 1, Section 10 outlines Post responsibilities to provide funds for this program. If the Post conducts Poppy sales, 50% of the sales to go the fund. Posts that do not conduct Poppy sales, Posts with less than 200 membership shall remit \$25; Posts with over 200 members \$40. We encourage all Posts to contribute to this fund.

LOUISIANA AMERICAN LEGION GETTING INVOLVED IN AMERICANISM YOUTH SHOOTING SPORTS PROGRAM

American Legion of Louisiana is about to start competing in the Americanism Junior Shooting Sports program. The Junior Shooting Sports program is an American Legion program under the Americanism Commission.

It is a gun safety education and marksmanship program that encompasses the basic element of safety, education, enjoyment and competition. Shooters use the .177 caliber air rifle. Both males and females can participate, through Legion sponsorship; disables youth are encouraged to join, as competitive shooting is a sport that creates an equal playing field for all competitors.

Two Louisiana Posts are looking at implementing the program. The Sulfur Post 179 and the Covington Post 16 are in the process of implementing the program. Junior Shooting Sports is a three-part program that combines the Basic Marksmanship Course, Qualification Awards and Air Rifle Competition into a well-rounded activity.

Louisiana Americanism Commission is looking at getting this program identified at the Department level with an awards program to be implemented and recognition given to individuals. This program will be discussed at the June Department Convention in Alexandria, Louisiana.
